# Use the Yellow bin

### PLASTIC:

Bottles for water, soft drinks oil, juices, etc. Bottles for detergents, soaps

**Tubes** for cream, sauces, syrups

Rigid packages for desserts in plastic or styrofoam, transparent boxes, rigid/flexible packages for food-

stuffs in general (cold cuts, cheeses, pasta)

Food trays (eggs, ice cream, etc.)

Pots of for yoghurt, cream cheese, desserts **Net bags** for fruit and vegetables

**Containers for the packaging** of various products (cosmetics, wet wipes, powdered products) Plastic bags for food in general (pasta, rice, crisps,

sweets, snacks)

Bags for gardening products, for detergents and animal feed

#### Small packaging plastic

(bottles, toilet paper packaging, etc.)

Styrofoam (if large, reduce the size) Blister packs and plastic shaped casings

Materials for the protection and transportation of goods (films, bubble wrap)


**Remove food** leftovers! Do not wash waste containers! Just remember to empty them well before disposing of them.



If small and without electronic parts. dispose of them in the unsorted waste bin. If large or with electronic parts, bring to the mobile Household Recycling centre

#### NO packages with hazard symbols:



Bring this waste to the mobile Household Recycling centre so that it can be disposed of with hazardous materials.

# Use the Green bin

#### Glass Bottles, flasks, and glass jars (steel and aluminium caps must be screwed onto the glass bottle/jar)

### Metal

Food boxes and iars Tin for soft drinks **Tops** and screw-on caps Aluminium trays for food Aluminium tubes (mayonnaise, creams, etc.) Aluminium foil (tin foil) Spray/aerosol cans (only if there are no danger symbols displayed on the packaging: Flame, Skull and X)

Steel and aluminium caps must be screwed to glass bottles and jars.

#### Break up the boxes!

Crush and fold cardboard boxes to reduce their volume.

#### What about pizza boxes?

Any pizza leftovers should be disposed of in the Organic bin and the cardboard in the Paper bin. If the base of the box is very greasy or too dirty, then it can be disposed of (only this part) in the organic waste bin, reducing it into small pieces to minimise its volume and the remainder in the Paper bin.



#### Plastic bags are not paper!

If you collect paper in plastic bags, empty the contents into the blue bin and dispose of the bag in the bin for plastic waste.

# **UNSORTED WASTE**

Use the Grey bin

Unsorted Waste does not mean that you can mix waste avoiding to recycle!

You can only dispose of the waste that cannot be recycled in this bin.

Nappies, pull-up pants/ incontinence pads and mattress protector. sanitary towels Plastic cutlerv Rubber and plastic toys Plastic coffee capsules CDs, DVDs Objects in ceramics. porcelain, Pyrex glass and alass-ceramic Dust from vacuum cleaners or house rubbish Incandescent lamps

Pens, felt pens and stationery in general Toothbrushes and sponges Wax, laminated and thermal paper (receipts) Baking paper, dirty paper and wet wipes **Cigarette butts** (extinguished) Straws Disposable masks and gloves Mirrors and crystal **Crystal glasses**

# **ORGANIC WASTE**



# Use the **Brown** bin

Fruit and vegetables waste Meat and fish in small pieces Dairy products Egg shells Grounds of tea and coffee or of other infusion drinks **Kitchen paper napkins** Paper handkerchiefs Sawdust and **wood ash** (completely cold and bagged) Kitchen absorbent paper (even wet or greasy) Leaves and soil Mussel and clam shells or other shellfish Animal bones, fruit stones Biodegradable Plastic and Bioplastics



Close the bag well! Dispose of the waste only after placing it in biodegradable and/or compostable bags.

## Some of the most common mistakes to avoid:

**NO** Cat litter

**NO** Nappies



Pet litter should generally be made of silicone (or similar) and disposed of with the Unsorted waste unless otherwise specified on the packaging (some litters are biodegradable and/or compostable)

#### **NO** Plastic bags



Dispose of organic waste inside biodegradable bags not in plastic bags

Dispose of it in the Paper

**NO** Paper and cardboard

NO Wood ash







# MOBILE HOUSEHOLD RECYCLING CENTRE

The Mobile household recycling centre is a natural complement to the sorted waste collection service, providing citizens with a way to dispose of materials that cannot be left in kerbside collection bins due to their size or type.

### WHERE AND WHEN:

- Via Cesare Cabras, parking area of the sports facility, compartment 7
- Tuesday and Thursday from 7:00 to 11:30 am

## WHAT CAN YOU BRING?

T (skull) and/or F (flame) marked containers; expired medicines; batteries; mixed bulky materials (sofas, armchairs, large plastic objects, mirrors, etc.); bulky FERROUS materials (iron, nets, chairs, iron furniture, etc.); bulky WOODEN materials (disassembled furniture, panels, chairs, etc.); Waste from Electrical and Electronic Equipment - WEEE (refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers, washing machines, air conditioning systems, mobile phones, TVs, PCs, etc.).

# **SMART RECYCLING CENTRES**

Smart recycling centres allow enabled users to easily dispose of plastic, paper/cardboard, organic waste, glass/steel/aluminium and unsorted waste.

## WHERE AND WHEN:

1. Via Capo Comino, at the parking area next to the Riu Saliu sports facility;

2. Via Cesare Cabras, at the parking area next to the entrance of the Dionigi Scano high school;

3. Via Nevio, at the parking area next to the oratory of San Giovanni Battista de La Salle church.

#### This service is active 24/7.

## HOW TO DISPOSE OF WASTE:

Enabled users can use the smart recycling centres by swiping the magnetic card that can be collected at the 'Eco-office in Via Giulio Cesare 161/A. This card must be collected by the TARI account holder. However, if they can't go personally for whatever reason, they can delegate a trusted person by submitting a copy of an ID card and the

written permission.
